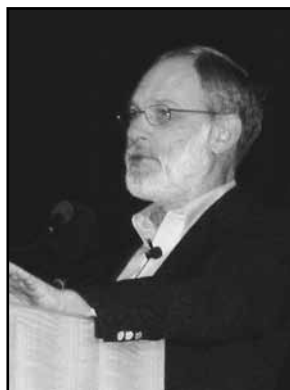

We at Messiah have had several opportunities to promote interfaith harmony and dialogue this past year. Back in January, 2011, our book club read and discussed *The Faith Club: A Muslim, A Christian, A Jew-- Three Women Search for Understanding* by Ranya Idliby, Suzanne Oliver and Priscilla Warner. For many of us, an interest and quest to begin a dialogue with those of other faiths was born. We then had an opportunity to worship with all faith traditions in Park Hill at the *Service of Remembering* on September 11, 2011 at Montview Presbyterian Church. Out of the clergies' alliance formed we have had two adult forums to promote harmony and understanding in our neighborhood and in the world, one with Rabbi Adam Morris from Temple Micah, and the other with Imam Ali from the Northeast Islamic Center, which were very informative and inspiring. We learned about The Interfaith Alliance of Colorado whose vision is to “demonstrate the human capacity

for compassion, cooperation and partnership in the service of the common good”, and the Greater Denver Interfaith Alliance. All activities were well attended and enjoyed.

During this week of interfaith harmony we can all participate by what we do, by what we say, and in prayer. If we remember that our common commandment is love of God and love of neighbor our world will be a better place.

Ten Messiah Women Participate in JustHope Pilot Program to Educate Women in Nicaragua

Ten Messiah women are participating in a pilot program, which is being facilitated by Reverend Leslie Penrose. Leslie is Executive Director of JustHope, a non-profit organization that creates global partnerships, combats poverty, and nurtures sustainable communities. Over the last few months, ten women of Messiah have been meeting, sharing a meal together, and exploring our role in a partnership with women in Nicaragua. Each woman has written an introductory letter about herself, and a video was produced to introduce Messiah women to Nicaraguan women.

Now, the Messiah women are anxiously waiting for some communication from Nicaragua, so the process of getting to know one another and working and praying together gets underway. Our main focus is to provide the funds and moral support needed for a young Nicaraguan woman to go to University for a year (\$1000 will cover tuition, supplies, and a small stipend for transportation or housing.) Our hope is that we will make a difference in educating women in Nicaragua...one woman at a time!

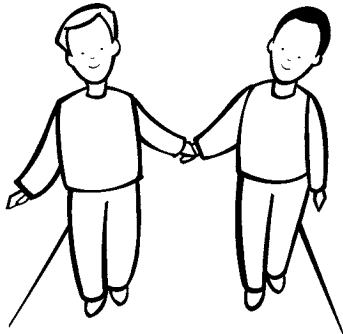

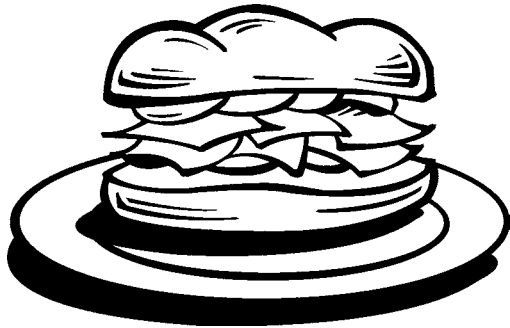

Spinach Balls
 2 pkgs. frozen chopped spinach
 (cooked and drained)
 1 large onion, chopped very fine
 4 eggs, beaten
 3/4 c. melted butter
 1/2 t. garlic salt
 3/4 c. grated parmesan cheese
 2 c. Pepperidge Farm herb dressing

Mix all ingredients thoroughly and chill for one hour. Form into 1 inch balls and bake on a cookie sheet for 20-25 minutes at 400 degrees or until lightly browned. Can be frozen and baked later. Makes 60-70 balls.

German Service Coordinator for Easter

Sometimes volunteer positions are an ongoing commitment. Sometimes they are a one-time event. The German service Coordinator for Easter is a one time commitment. Check This Out Sandy Fischbach

So many people tell me they love to read but just have no time with all the obligations they have every day. For those of us who make reading a priority but sometimes find reading a book is impractical or just not feasible, (like on long car rides where I get motion sickness while reading,) an audiobook is a good alternative. It's also a great way to make those boring tasks that don't need our full attention like washing dishes, ironing or exercising more enjoyable.

My selection for the month of February is *Rediscovering Values: On Wall Street, Main Street, and Your Street*, which we have on CD. The author, Jim Wallis, is a theologian, speaker, preacher, and international commentator on religion, public life, faith, and politics. He is president and CEO of Sojourners, <http://www.sojo.net/>, where he is editor-in-chief of Sojourners magazine. He has taught at Harvard's Divinity School and Kennedy School of Government on Faith, Politics, and Society and has written several books, including *God's Politics*, which we also have on our New Books shelf. His premise is that this economic crisis can become an opportunity for America to take a look at its core principles and redirect our priorities. This is an important book to read, or listen to, in this election year and helps define to whom and for what we have responsibility as Christians and Americans.

Dinner With Friends

Patty Cordova is coordinating this group! Sign up and you will be placed with others for a four month period, meeting at each participant's home once during those four months. Your group will decide on the date and time. The size of the group will vary depending on how many sign up. Ideally the groups would have between five and eight friends, single and couples.

We ask that groups be child friendly, but if you are unable to host children in your home, indicate that preference when you call and we will place you in an appropriate group.

The host home will supply the main course and others will bring what ever you decide on to complete the meal.

After you've met at each home, you will have the opportunity to join a new group of friends and start the process over again. This is great way to get to know one another and to build relationships with Messiah members and friends. Church membership is not a prerequisite. If you have friends that would like to participate, please invite them to do so.

King Soopers Cards

What do you spend on groceries and gas each week? Is it \$100 or \$200? You could be contributing 5% of that to Messiah. Even though that doesn't sound like much, \$5 or \$10 per week, when you multiply that by 52 weeks it adds up to a significant amount by which you could be increasing your pledge at no cost to you. We are currently receiving over \$250 per month so those who are participating are doing a great job, over \$5000 in purchases by only 23 cards that were used in December, but we could do better if we all participate. You can order a card for any amount, just fill out the form and give us a check or cash. We must have orders for the cumulative amount of \$200 or more to order. If you already have a card, please keep reloading it. One member told me it really helped her budget because she reloads the card each month for a certain amount and tries to keep her purchases within that dollar figure. And it really helps our budget, too.

Don't shop at King Soopers? Why not put the money you save shopping somewhere else into a special fund for MCC, or clip coupons and pledge that amount to give? One of my friends puts her pocketbook change in a jar each week and is amazed at how quickly it adds up. We could use every bit in a big way from paying expenses to increasing our benevolence fund for the synod that does a huge amount of good work.

Messiah Mountain “Trailhead”

As the congregation moves forward this year, the Messiah Mountain Retreat Center committee/team begins its new journey for 2012. As such, we will be providing the congregation with monthly updates in the Messenger and we will call it the Trailhead because it is a new journey and we are at the beginning of this awesome trek.

The committee/team met in mid-January and formalized some teams to help run the retreat center. The teams are Finance, Communications, Operations and Congregational Liaison. We also welcomed Irene Brock to our ranks.

By the end of February, we will have a draft budget for the year's operations as well as a draft marketing plan. Duane Larson is also starting to look into the rezoning possibilities with Jefferson County. Currently, our zoning states that if a building is damaged over 50%, we cannot repair it. It would have to remain in that state of disrepair or torn down without the possibility of being replaced. So the committee believes it would be in the best interest of the congregation to see what needs to be done to make sure that we can maintain the buildings and operations. Since the congregation voted to keep the retreat center, we are just trying to make sure that we maintain our stewardship of the property.

Paul Weber has already had contact from the Week of Hope youth group that has, for the past two years, provided labor to the mountain. They want to come back again with their kids and do some more free work for us for a week this summer. Last year, they painted the decks on both the lodge and dorm, cut some of the dead trees, helped with the trail system

and other projects. It was very beneficial for us and the kids were also moved by the beauty of the mountain property and the spiritual benefits they received.

We have an additional website that makes it easier for groups to find us and even to register their group online. That site is www.messiahmountain.org. Jacques Stallman has started developing the site in addition to getting the retreat center on Facebook. Check them both out and keep coming back to see the new additions.

Other items the committee is looking at is (1) to rename the main lodge as the Ed and Leona Bock Center in honor of their gifts of time and money to Messiah Mountain. With the renovations they funded and their bequest to the mountain, they contributed over \$250,000 to the mountain ministry; (2) check the septic system operability of the dorm, (3) install a swing/play system outside the lodge and (4) freshen/upgrade some of the lodge building. As only maintenance was allowed over the past couple of years, the committee feels that it is time to make some minor improvements to the lodge and existing grounds. This will enhance the appearance of the property as well as make a nicer first impression to groups using our mountain.

We encourage all Messiah members to use the mountain retreat center for a family reunion, your Circle, youth group gathering, or just a day for self reflection in the mountains. After all, it is our property so we should use it. Besides, there is no cost to church members.

All in all, the committee is very excited to see how the coming year unfolds.

God Hates Religion

I am going to tell you something amazing. God hates religion. That does not fit with the way we usually think of things. Most people think of religion as God’s thing. Let’s back up for a minute. What is this religion God hates? It is religion to make a good impression, religion to look good, religion to make yourself feel good, religion as public spectacle, religion that is an external practice that might not have anything to do with what is going on inside a person, or the way a person lives. That’s what God is into . . . what’s going on inside a person, not what’s on the outside.

Jesus too is much more interested in what is going on inside people’s lives than in fancy religious shows. Jesus’ sermon on the mount in Matthew 6 talks about piety and the way we show our reverence for God.

Do this, Jesus says, without making a big show of it. As a matter of fact, Jesus says to do it and look cheerful while you’re doing it. Spare us the sacrificial show. You don’t have to tell the world; just do it. Don’t give in to every little temptation that bounces up in front of you. Keep yourself under control.

There Jesus stops. He offers these three guidelines for living faithfully in the world; three steps toward the powerful presence of God’s Holy Spirit. Share with the poor. Pray. Live under control, and as you do, let God’s power flow through you.

As we begin the season of Lent by marking our foreheads with ashes, may we remember those times when we have tried to use religion to impress others. Let them go, and stir up new efforts for simple living, sharing, praying, and the power of positive piety. God hates religion . . . but God loves people. And God’s love changes lives.

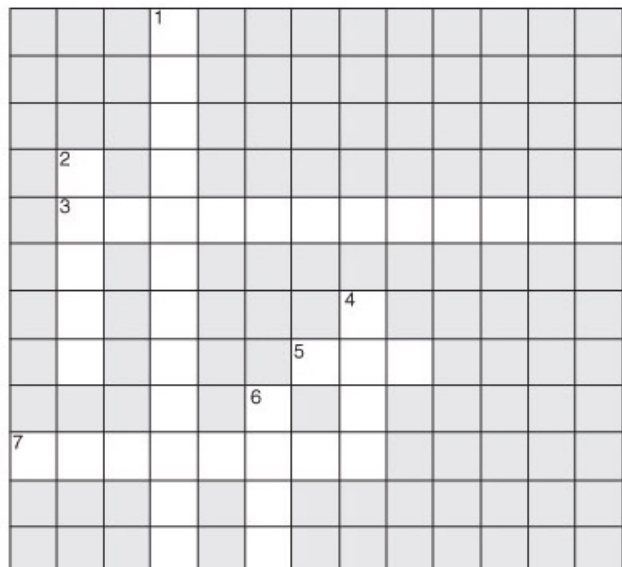
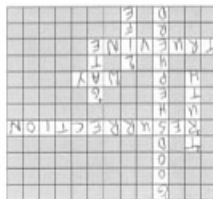
